# How much time do students spend on coursework, outside of class?

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### Data Collection

- For each assignment during the second half of EOSC 340, we asked students to report how much time they spent on it. All assignments (and answers to this question) were collected electronically in VISTA
- The answer (for EOSC 340)?

## ~ 6.5 hours/week outside of class

• On middle-of-term, or end-of-term surveys in several courses, we asked students to compare their workload in that course to EACH of their other courses. Here's what the questions looked like:

Please enter one of your OTHER courses here (e.g. ENGL 100) \_\_\_\_\_\_\_

Rate the time you spend on EOSC 340, compared to the course you entered above a. I spend MUCH MORE time on EOSC 340 than I spend on the course listed above b. I spend a LITTLE MORE time on EOSC 340 than I spend on the course listed above c. I spend about the same amount of time on EOSC 340 and the course listed above d. I spend a LITTLE LESS time on EOSC 340 than I spend on the course listed above e. I spend MUCH LESS time on EOSC 340 than I spend on the course listed above



# Qualitative data about EOSC 340 perceived workloads

#### **ANONYMOUS FEEDBACK** ON VISTA DISCUSSION BOARD:

17 of 91 postings say or imply "too much work" (~19%)

#### **MIDDLE-OF-TERM SURVEY:**

18 of 100 comments say or imply "too much work" (~18%)

#### **END-OF-TERM SURVEY:**

What works well?

25 of 65 (38%) say "the assignments" (most say "clickers")

4 of 65 say/imply "too much work" (6%)

3 of 65 specifically expressed support for the work load (5%)

What could be improved?

16 of 65 say/imply "too much work" (23%)

# Some quotes about workload (from EOSC 340, an average of 6.5 hours/week)

they need to reduce the amount of homework and assignments they issue, especially within the week of midterms. - they need to take into account that the student has other commitments other than this class including other courses and midterms and more respect needs to be given to the student's time -

Despite a lot of complaints from students, I think that all of the assignments and readings have helped me stay on track and get a better sense of what is expected on the exam. They also provide great practice on days leading up to the exam.

...if I wasn't taking 3 other EOSC classes, I wouldn't be making that type of comment, but with the EOSC "reform" now reaching the many corners of the department, I'm having more and more frequent assignments in all my EOSC classes. Don't get me wrong, I really love the approach and I think it is working very well in all of my classes, it's just becoming a little insane keeping up with so many little assignments due all week (eg. 4 from this class, plus at least 2-3 from each of my other 3 EOSC).

I've never been so well-prepared for an exam - it's astonishing. I know people were complaining that there were too many [assignments] and they were too frequent, but I STRONGLY disagree. I even think you shortened/weakened/briefed them too much by the end of the term. The length and difficulty of them by the end of January was perfect. I sincerely hope you do not change this aspect of the course for next year, as it was pivotal in my success in this course.

Overall the expected weekly workload for this class is far too high. I love the material but I am not doing nearly as well as I would like to be doing in this class as I honestly just don't have the time to put into it.
